Safety Instructions

When using electrical appliances, basic safety precautions should always be followed.

Check that the voltage indicated on the rating plate corresponds with that of the local network before connecting the appliance to the mains power supply. Children aged from 8 years and people with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge can use this appliance, only if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.

Unless they are older than 8 and supervised, children should not perform cleaning or user maintenance.

This appliance is not a toy.

This appliance contains no user serviceable parts. If the power supply cord, plug or any part of the appliance is malfunctioning or if it has been dropped or damaged, only a qualified electrician should carry out repairs. Improper repairs may place the user at risk of harm.

Keep the appliance out of the reach of children.

Keep the appliance and its supply cord away from heat or sharp edges that could cause damage.

Keep the appliance free from dust, lint, hair or anything that may reduce the airflow of the appliance.

Do not use the appliance with wet hands.

Do not use this appliance if any of the openings are blocked.

Do not use the appliance to pick up flammable liquid, matches, cigarette ends, hot ashes or any hot, burning or smoking objects.

Do not use this appliance to pick up hard, sharp objects such as glass or nails etc.

Do not fit any parts/accessories other than the parts supplied with this appliance, as this may cause damage.

Do not use the appliance to pick up water or any other liquid, as this poses risk of an electric shock.

Do not immerse the appliance in water or any other liquid.

Do not use the appliance for anything other than its intended use.

Do not use this appliance outdoors.

Do not leave the appliance unattended whilst connected to the mains power supply.

Do not remove from the mains power supply by pulling the cord; switch off and remove the plug by hand.

Do not store the appliance in direct sunlight or in high humidity conditions. Always unplug the appliance after use and before any cleaning or maintenance.

Use of an extension cord with the appliance is not recommended.

This appliance should not be operated by means of an external timer or separate remote control system.

This appliance is intended for domestic use only. It should not be used for commercial purposes.

Battery Safety

The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.

Exhausted batteries should be removed from the product to avoid leakage.

In the event of any batteries leaking, do not allow any liquid to come into contact with the skin or eyes.

If contact has been made, wash the affected area with copious amounts of water and seek medical advice.

Keep batteries out of the reach of children.

Avoid storing in direct sunlight.

Do not dispose of batteries in a fire.

Do not crush, puncture, dismantle or otherwise damage batteries.

Do not store above 60 °C.

Do not expose batteries to heat or fire as they may explode.

Do not subject batteries to mechanical shock.

Do not dispose of exhausted batteries in household waste.

To dispose of any batteries, take them to a local recycling station.

Contact the local government offices for further details.

This product is fitted with a 22.2 V 2150 mAh Li-ion battery (non-removable).



Battery Removal and Disposal

The battery must be disposed at the end of the appliances life. To remove the battery from the vacuum cleaner, unfasten the screws and dismantle the product to gain access. This will require a crosshead screwdriver (not included).

Withdraw the battery and unclip the live and neutral terminal connections. To dispose of the exhausted battery, take it to a local recycling station. Contact the local government offices for further details.

Safety Cut-out Device

The vacuum cleaner features a safety cut-out device which will cause the vacuum cleaner to lose power if the floor brush, HEPA filter and dust container are not cleaned regularly. If the air inlet becomes blocked, or the floor brush stops rotating for longer than 3 seconds, the abnormal indication light on the LED display will flash red, and the vacuum cleaner will lose power. If the vacuum cleaner cuts out, switch off the vacuum cleaner. Remove any attachments and clear the obstruction, checking the floor brush for any blockages, following the instructions in the section entitled 'Cleaning the Floor Brush'. Proceed to empty the dust container and clean the filters before using again.

Dos and Don'ts

Do:

Check that the HEPA filter and sponge filter are kept clear of obstruction. Make sure that the dust container and filters are cleaned regularly to preserve suction and prolong the life of the vacuum cleaner. Clean the dust container and filters at least once a month with clean water to keep the vacuum cleaner working efficiently. Ensure that the floor brush is kept free from built-up dust and dirt. Clean the brush bar regularly.

Don't:

Use the vacuum cleaner without the filters or dust container in position. Use the vacuum cleaner to pick up flammable liquids, matches, cigarette ends, hot ashes or any hot, burning or smoking objects. Use the vacuum cleaner to pick up water or any other liquid, as this poses risk of an electric shock.

Care and Maintenance

Wipe the external surface of the vacuum cleaner with a soft, damp cloth and allow to dry thoroughly.

Do not use any harsh or abrasive detergents cleaning agents to clean any part of the vacuum cleaner.

Keep filters clean and replace when they become worn.

Getting Started

Remove the appliance from the box.

Remove any packaging from the appliance.

Place the packaging inside the box and either store or dispose of safely.

Instructions for Use

Before First Use

Before using the vacuum cleaner for the first time, clean it with a soft, damp cloth and dry thoroughly. Do not immerse the vacuum cleaner in water or any other liquid.

Charging the 2 in I Cordless Vac

Before first use, the vacuum cleaner must be charged for approx. 3—4 hours. Subsequent charging times will vary dependent upon use. If the vacuum cleaner battery becomes drained completely during use, it may take up to 3—4 hours to fully recharge.

STEP I: Switch off the vacuum cleaner.

STEP 2: The vacuum cleaner fits neatly onto the charging station. Slot the base of the handheld unit onto the charging station, so that the adaptor engages with the mains power inlet.

STEP 3: Plug the mains power adaptor into the mains power supply; the lights on the LED display will flash progressively as the battery charges. Once the battery is fully charged, all of the lights on the LED display will remain illuminated and the charging station will automatically stop charging, to preserve the lifespan of the battery.

Warning: Do not use any mains power adaptor other than that supplied. Using an alternative will increase the risk of damage to the appliance or injury to the user.

Using the 2 in I Cordless Vac

STEP I: Remove the vacuum cleaner from the charging station after unplugging it from the mains power supply.

STEP 2: Turn on the vacuum cleaner by pressing and holding the power trigger. The LED display will illuminate green to signal that the vacuum cleaner has powered on.

Note: The LED indicator lights represent battery charge and will illuminate during use; if all four are illuminated green, the battery is fully charged. The LED indicator lights will extinguish one at a time as the battery runs out of charge. The usage time for the vacuum cleaner is approx. 25 minutes.

Warning: Do not use the vacuum cleaner without the HEPA filter or dust tank in position. Regularly clean the HEPA filter to preserve the suction of the vacuum cleaner.



Using the Extension Tube and Floor Brush

To use the vacuum cleaner as a stick vac, the extension tube needs to be connected. The extension tube can only be fitted one way; ensure that the extension tube release button is positioned closest to the floor brush. Refer to the 'Description of Parts' section for a labelled diagram depicting the two ends of the extension tube.

STEP I: Attach the extension tube to the handheld unit by inserting 'End A' of the extension tube into the handheld unit until it clicks securely into position.

STEP 2: Install the floor brush by attaching 'End B' of the extension tube onto the floor brush air inlet, until it clicks securely into position. The extension tube release button is closest to 'End B' of the extension tube and so should be closest to the floor brush when connected.

STEP 3: Once the floor brush has been attached, turn on the vacuum cleaner by pressing and holding the power trigger. The LED display will illuminate green to signal that the vacuum cleaner has powered on.

STEP 4: Turn off the vacuum cleaner by releasing the power trigger.

Using the Crevice Tool

The shape of the crevice tool makes it ideal for removing dust and dirt from folds in fabrics, radiators, corners, recesses and other hard-to-reach areas.

STEP I: If required, fit the extension tube onto the handheld unit air inlet.

STEP 2: Simultaneously press the accessory release button and push the crevice tool onto the end of the extension tube. If no extension is required, push the crevice tool directly onto the handheld unit air inlet.

STEP 3: Turn on the vacuum cleaner by pressing and holding the power trigger. The LED display will illuminate green to signal that the vacuum cleaner has powered on.

STEP 4: To remove the crevice tool from the extension tube or handhled unit air inlet, firmly grip the tool whilst carefully pulling it away from the handheld unit.

Using the 360 ° Rotating Dusting Brush

The 360 $^{\circ}$ rotating dusting brush is suitable for cleaning surfaces such as skirting boards, windowsills and bookshelves. The bristles are great for lifting dirt and dust, and the rotating function makes the brush ideal for awkward angles.

STEP I: If required, fit the extension tube onto the handheld unit air inlet.

STEP 2: Simultaneously press the accessory release button and push the 360 ° rotating dusting brush onto the end of the extension tube. If no extension is required, push the 360 ° rotating dusting brush directly onto the handheld unit air inlet.

STEP 3: Rotate the end of the 360 ° rotating dusting brush to choose the desired function.

STEP 4: Turn on the vacuum cleaner by pressing and holding the power trigger. The LED display will illuminate green to signal that the vacuum cleaner has powered on.

STEP 5: To remove the 360 ° rotating dusting brush from the extension tube or handheld unit

air inlet, firmly grip the tool whilst carefully pulling it away from the handheld unit.

Emptying the Dust Container

Before emptying the dust container, switch off the vacuum cleaner and make sure that it is not connected to the charging station. If the vacuum cleaner has been used as a handheld unit, remove the chosen attachment by carefully pulling it out of the handheld unit air inlet. It is recommended to empty the dust container outdoors.

- **STEP I:** Whilst securely holding the handheld unit, remove the dust container by unfastening the dust container lock and lifting the dust container away from the handheld unit.
- **STEP 2:** Holding the dust container vertically, pull the filter housing away from the dust container using the handles. Place the filter housing to one side.
- **STEP 3:** Positioned over a bin or refuse bag, empty the dust container slowly and carefully to reduce the amount of dust released back into the atmosphere.
- **STEP 4:** Rotate the HEPA filter in an anticlockwise direction and pull it out of the filter housing. If there is any dust or residue remaining, clean it following the instructions in the section entitled 'Cleaning the HEPA Filter and Sponge Filter'.
- **STEP 5:** Replace the HEPA filter into the dust container and then refit the dust container by placing it inside the handheld unit, ensuring that the locking tab and slot are aligned with the corresponding slots.

Note: The dust container can be cleaned once empty by rinsing it under clean, warm water. Allow to dry thoroughly for approx. 24 hours.

Cleaning the HEPA Filter and Sponge Filter

The HEPA filter and sponge filter can only be accessed when the dust container has been removed from the handheld unit.

- **STEP I:** Remove and empty the dust container by following the instructions in the section entitled 'Emptying the Dust Container' and place it to one side.
- **STEP 2:** Holding the filter housing, rotate the HEPA filter in an anticlockwise direction and pull it out of the filter housing using the handles in the centre. Turn over the HEPA filter and remove the sponge filter by pulling it away from the HEPA filter.
- **STEP 3:** Shake both filters until the majority of the dust has been removed, then rinse under clean, warm water and allow them to dry naturally for approx. 24 hours.
- **STEP 4:** Once the filters are fully dry, refit them back into the filter housing. Place the filter housing back into the dust container by ensuring that the locking tabs are aligned with the corresponding slots on the dust container. Twist the filter housing in a clockwise direction to lock it back into position.

Note: Do not clean the HEPA filter using detergents or use external heat sources such as radiators to dry the HEPA filter.



Warning: Do not reassemble or use the vacuum cleaner until both of the removable filters are fully dry, as this could cause damage.

Cleaning the Floor Brush

It is important to clean the floor brush on a regular basis to achieve optimal cleaning performance when using the vacuum cleaner. The floor brush can be removed for easy cleaning. Always ensure that it is replaced correctly before attempting to use it as an upright vacuum cleaner.

STEP I: Press the accessory release button and pull the floor brush away from the extension tube. This will reveal the floor brush air inlet, which may become blocked after prolonged usage. Using a thin tool, clear the floor brush air inlet of any debris.

STEP 2: Holding the floor brush upside down, slide the locking tabs upwards on the two end covers, releasing the brush bar.


STEP 3: Lift the brush bar out of the floor brush and remove any built-up debris from the brush bar and brush bar cavity. Use a thin tool to remove any built-up debris from inside of the floor brush.

STEP 4: Replace the brush bar, ensuring that the ends are correctly aligned with the corresponding slots on the floor brush.

STEP 5: Refit the end covers back onto the floor brush and secure the locking tabs into place.

Storage

Check that the vacuum cleaner is cool, clean and dry before storing in a cool, dry place. The vacuum cleaner can be stored neatly by placing the handheld unit, extension tube and all attachments onto the charging station.



Troubleshooting

Problems	Cause	Solutions
The vacuum cleaner will not charge.	The mains power adaptor lead is not securely connected.	Plug the mains power adaptor on the charging station into the mains power supply, ensuring that it is switched on and follow the instructions in the section entitled 'Charging the 2 in 1 Cordless Vac'.
The suction is poor.	The air inlet is blocked.	Disconnect the attachment and clear the blockage.
	The dust container is almost full.	Empty the dust container following the instructions in the section entitled 'Emptying the Dust Container.
	The filters are blocked.	Clean the filter following the instructions in the section entitled 'Cleaning the HEPA Filter and Sponge Filter'.
	The floor brush and brush has become ineffective due to built-up debris.	Clean the brush bar and floor brush following the instructions in the section entitled 'Cleaning the Floor Brush'.
